

To say that *Griffin* came to us in horrific condition is an understatement. Griffin was found at a local softball field after being neglected, or on the run, for a VERY long time. He was living in what can only be described as a hardened cast that was his matted and mangled fur. He could not see because his hair was crusted over his eyes. He had wounds that were infested with maggots. Between our staff and a wonderful volunteer groomer, his cast, and his past, were chiseled away. Then Griffin came down with pneumonia, and we feared he might not make it. Griffin received a ton of our signature VAO TLC and was nursed back to life. He ultimately found a loving home with two 2-legged and two 4-legged siblings where he is thriving!

Tastykake came to us after he was abandoned by his family. As it turned out, he has diabetes and requires insulin injections twice daily. While he is a super sweet and friendly fella, finding an adopter willing to take on a diabetic animal is a challenge. Enter our friends at Sheehan Veterinary Centre. Tastykake is now an office cat and living the life of a king!



Griffin and Tastykake are just two of the THOUSANDS of animals that come through our doors every year. Each and every one receives the individual attention that they so deserve. After being let down by their humans, we consider it an honor to give them the love, kindness and care that every living creature deserves.

### Ho, Ho, Ho... Did You Know?

There are so many worthy organizations out there – what makes the VAO so special? First and foremost, the VAO is a municipal animal shelter dedicated to providing shelter, food and medical care to local stray and unwanted animals until their forever homes can be found. We are an open intake shelter serving 28 towns in Southern New Jersey. That means we accept every stray or unwanted cat or dog from those towns. We don't get to pick and choose our animals. We take in all of them. These poor souls come to us in varying conditions, often times broken in body and/or spirit. Regardless of their

### **Emergency Medical Fund**

**Eugene** came to us after being hit by a car. **Pirate** needed entropion surgery on his eye. **Sweet Potato** had an upper respiratory infection that turned critical. **Maxwell** had a broken bone in his leg and required water therapy. These are just a few of the examples of animals that needed extra medical attention in 2023. Thanks to our **Emergency Medical Fund**, we were able to give these animals, and so many more just like them, the medical attention that they needed. If it weren't for the generosity of our supporters, the Emergency Medical Fund would not exist!

condition, we accept them and give them the very best care possible. Our goal is to meet, or exceed, a live release rate of 90% or greater (a.k.a. "No Kill"). We are proud to say we have met that goal for more than the past five years and are on track for this year as well!

The VAO is also an adoption center. That means when space allows, we are able to work with our rescue partners to save animals from over-crowded, high-kill shelters and rescues.

The number of animals in our care continues to grow, especially with dogs. We've seen a 24% increase in the number of dogs we've received from the public (stray and surrendered) compared to last year. Unfortunately, there has been a 13% decrease in the number of animals reclaimed for the same period as well. More dogs are getting lost or being surrendered, but fewer are being reclaimed. We've also sadly seen a real decline in the conditions that many animals come to us. Between the current state of the economy, and a growing number of housing evictions, pets are the ones paying the price! But that is where the VAO comes in to help! It's our mission to care for those forgotten animals, and we'll do whatever it takes to save them.

We are saving lives on a shoe-string budget with minimal staff and space. Our only income is the meager monthly fees that we receive from the towns that we serve, and our adoption fees. Otherwise we rely very heavily upon the generosity of our supporters to even keep the lights on for our homeless animals.

So, why should you support the VAO? We are a true "underdog," pun intended. This may sound cliché be we really are a small shelter with a big heart. Ours is a modest facility, on which we are still paying a mortgage. We take in the animals that no one wants. We take pride in going the extra mile to ensure that our animals go to the homes best suited for their needs. We are a grassroots organization with minimal staff and no fancy bells and whistles. Our staff and volunteers take incredible pride in doing whatever it takes to help the animals in our care.
